How can we afford to not intervene?


- 25% of children in Georgia live in poverty








CORNERS ACADEMY METHODS

- Partner with the local elementary school by working directly with Parent Liaison and school specialist
- Parents sign release forms so information can be shared with Corners and an individual plan can be created for each student
- Year round programming by offering Corners Camp during the summer
- Students get both academic skills and life skills



We work in Title I schools with the lowest poverty levels. According to the 2014 Georgia Department of Education, there are 1,013 Title I elementary schools. In Gwinnett, DeKalb and Fulton County there are 138 Title I elementary schools. By 2025, we will offer our program to 35 Title I schools by 2025; 25%.




Deportations in the US are on the Rise






How Metro Atlanta became a "pioneer" of Immigration Enforcement



One Region initiative in Metro Atlanta

The One Region Initiative will create an inclusive metro Atlanta region in which all people, including immigrants and refugees, have the opportunity to reach their greatest potential, engage with the larger community, and fully contribute their talents - expanding prosperity and well-being for all. The program will do this by gaining the solid commitment of local government, business leaders, community organizations, immigrant and refugee communities, and members of the receiving communities to create and then adopt welcoming practices.
